Introduction of Ordinances

10A introduces an amendment to Capital Ordinance 2208-15 and 2268-17 to include “pedestrian activated crossing – various locations.” We have identified the need for one on Eggert Crossing Road in front of the Lawrence Neighborhood Center and also on Lawrence Road in front of St. Ann School and Varsity Pizza, and seek to include this in the ordinance description.

10B introduces an amendment to Bond Ordinance 2258-17, 2270-17 and 2271-17 to include the purchase of various equipment (single axle dump truck outfitted with snow removal capacity).

10C introduces an ordinance to establish guidelines to safely manage traffic conditions arising from street construction, maintenance operations, utility work and other events. In addition to the manning of the Traffic Bureau, this ordinance will provide a clear framework to implement safe procedures for traffic control,

Adoption of Ordinances

11A is for the adoption of a Bond Ordinance appropriating \$1,425,000 for various road improvements. The road improvement plan includes: mill, overlay and reconstruction of Fackler Road from Route 206 to Princeton Pike; miscellaneous guide rail replacements, road stripping and address drainage issues; and the installation of a Pedestrian Activated

Crossing at Province Line Road and Bannister Road. Approximately 25 roads across the Township will be improved from these funds.

Resolutions

The agenda includes routine administrative authorizations as well as resolutions providing for refunds, bond releases and acceptances.¹

18A.1. This is for bonding of 2 Princess Road (Medical Society of NJ building) construction project that received Zoning Board approval (expansion of the existing building).

18E.1 This is a grant of \$1,500 from the GSMJIF to partially offset the cost of our police accreditation.

18E.3 This is a grant for \$69,365.19 for our recycling program.

18E.4 This is a grant for \$119,261.30 from Mercer County to offset the cost of the inclusionary program.

18E.5. This is a grant for \$15,600 from DVPC to fund the cost for an alternative analysis of the potential connections within the Dyson track for the Lawrence Hopewell Trail.
