Arbor Day Foundation Names Lawrence Township Tree City USA®

Lawrence Township was named a 2019 Tree City USA® by the Arbor Day Foundation in honor of its commitment to effective urban forest management.

Lawrence Township achieved Tree City USA recognition by meeting the program's four requirements: a tree board or department, a tree care ordinance, an annual community forestry budget of at least \$2 per capita and an Arbor Day observance and proclamation. It is Lawrence Township's 24th year participating in the program.

"Tree City USA communities see the impact an urban forest has in a community first hand," said Dan Lambe, President of the Arbor Day Foundation. "The trees being planted and cared for by Lawrence Township are ensuring that generations to come will enjoy to a better quality of life. Additionally, participation in this program brings residents together and creates a sense of civic pride, whether it's through volunteer engagement or public education."

"It is organizations like the Arbor Day Foundation that have long lasting, positive impacts on communities and the environment. Lawrence Township is honored by being named a Tree City USA, and we pledge to continue to do our part to plant, nurture and celebrate trees", said Mayor James Kownacki.

If ever there was a time for trees, now is that time. Communities worldwide are facing issues with air quality, water resources, personal health and well-being, energy use, and protection from extreme heat and flooding. The Arbor Day Foundation recently launched the *Time for Trees* initiative to address these issues, with unprecedented goals of planting 100 million trees in forests and communities and inspiring 5 million tree planters by 2022. With Tree City USA recognition, Lawrence Township has demonstrated a commitment to effective urban forest management and doing its part to help address these challenges for Lawrence Township residents now and in the future.
