

Lawrence Township Plans Grand Opening for Hero Dog Park

Lawrence Township, NJ has completed a significant renovation project at Hamnett Park, Hero Dog Park, introducing new amenities for both residents and their canine companions. The \$500,000 project includes the addition of two separate dog park areas for large and small dogs, as well as various passive recreational improvements throughout the park.

The dog park areas, which account for approximately half of the project budget, feature new fencing, landscaping, shade structures, benches, and specialized equipment. The remaining funds were allocated to enhance the park's overall appeal, with additions including a perimeter walking path, improved lighting, electrical and water services, a patio seating area, and landscaping upgrades. Mayor Patricia Hendricks Farmer expressed enthusiasm for the project, highlighting the benefits for both pets and park-goers. The township anticipates receiving a \$125,000 grant from the Mercer at Play program to help offset the costs.

A grand opening ceremony for the dog park area is scheduled for August 8th at 5:30 pm. However, the Public Works department is currently focusing on lawn maturation before officially welcoming residents and their dogs to the new facilities.

With this addition, Lawrence Township now boasts two off-leash dog areas, complementing the existing facility at Village Park. The Hamnett Park improvements aim to provide enhanced recreational opportunities for the community, balancing the needs of pet owners with those seeking a peaceful outdoor experience.


Retiree Spotlight: Det. James Smith #10

LAWRENCE TOWNSHIP DOG OWNERS

It is NJ State law, as well as a Lawrence Township ordinance that ALL dogs 7 months and older must be licensed . Dog licenses must be renewed each year. A dog cannot be licensed unless it is properly vaccinated. Residents should be aware that if their dog is off a leash in public areas a court summons may be issued, except on their private property or at one of the (2) dog parks in Lawrence Township. Retractable leashes or leashes longer than six (6) feet in length are not acceptable leashes to use while in public.

A license tag helps police, animal control, and shelters quickly identify your pet and get them back to you safely. If your pet is found wandering the streets, a rescue entity can see your pets tag via its license ID number. Dogs that are not licensed tend to be kept at the shelter longer and also require payment to be released.
