- Education and support for families and caregivers as well as patients




Alzheimer's Disease is the most common cause of dementia and the fourth leading cause of death, after heart disease, cancer and stroke. It occurs in five to seven percent of the population over 65, and in up to half the population over 85. It affects people of every ethnic, social and economic group.

People with Alzheimer's disease or other kinds of dementia always have memory loss and confusion and may also experience: disorientation, hallucinations, delusions, mood swings, wandering and combativeness.

There are many illnesses and conditions that can cause these symptoms and some are treatable.

If someone you love is experiencing any of these symptoms, it's important that they receive proper diagnosis and treatment.
